

Carpet Cleaning Guide Dry Foam Method





Carpet Cleaning Guide: Dry Foam Method

Dry foam carpet cleaning is a relatively long task and it is recommended that it is done only when needed rather than on a regular basis.

Preparation of the area

- Assemble all the equipment and ensure it is in good working order, make sure the carpet is clear and place out any necessary caution signs.
- Pick up any large items of rubbish and vacuum carpet.
- Pre-treat any spots or stains in the area to be cleaned. Always ensure that you test a small inconspicuous area before use to check for colour fastness.

Dry Foam Cleaning Advice

- Prepare dry foam carpet shampoo ensuring the correct dilution rate and pour into solution tank. Take care to check solution on an inconspicuous area beforehand as a precaution against carpet damage.
- Fit the shampoo brush to the rotary machine.
- Ensure that only a trained operative uses a rotary floor cleaning machine. Using the machine to ensure a consistent level of foam is created in all areas.
- Leave the carpet to dry.
- Vacuum the area.

- Rotary floor cleaning machine, slow speed (Suggested products: Taski Ergo Disc 200 / 238 (NW codes 17055/17037))
- Shampoo Brush
- Solution Tank
